Minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 26 January 2017 in the Rankin Room Victory Hall, Broughton-in-Furness

01/17 Apologies

Resolved to accept apologies from Cllr L Burch, Cllr J Johnson and Cllr G Pitts.

02/17 Requests for Dispensations

There were no requests for dispensations.

03/17 Declaration of Interests

There were none.

Resolved that no items are to be discussed in private.

05/17 Minutes

Resolved that the minutes of the meeting held on Thursday 24 November 2016 be signed by the chair as a true record.

06/17 Public Participation.

- a) Police were not in attendance but had sent a report in to the clerk reporting that there was the normal selection of domestic bliss over Christmas period, driving off the road and into each other. The only 3 logs of real note are thefts at Low Wood Style Cottage, Prince of Wales and an attempted burglary at Syke House Farm.
- b) Cllr David Fletcher was not in attendance and had not sent in any report.
- c) Public Annette Carmichael was in attendance and gave a report from the recent meeting with Victoria Upton (Cumbria County Council), County Cllr D Fletcher, Cllr J Curwen (District Cllr), Cllr E Knowles (Duddon Parish Council) and Annette Carmichael (Broughton Community Led Plan Steering Group).

 County Cllr Fletcher will be allocating funds of approximately £6000 (£1,600 already spent at the school on road markings and flashing lights etc. This meeting focused on items that could be implemented at a relatively low cost. Discussions included don't follow Satnav signs, re-paint give way markings, drop kerb signage and red markings from archway to centre of Square to make an informal crossing, remove middle line at Wreaks End and put markings at side of road. Informal crossings at Foxfield Station and Bush Green. Extend the footpath along Foxfield Road to join up with existing path. Annette has put more 20 is plenty signs out near the school.

Anettee was concerned that Ulverston Post Office being franchised and put into another business. Broughton Post Office have also had a letter and John Woodcock MP is looking into this as nothing has changed since last year and no other eligible business in Broughton is willing to take it on.

Phil Ruston was in attendance from Connecting Cumbria and sought the support of the Parish Council regarding a Digital Inclusion Event in the Victory Hall so that people and businesses in our community are aware of whats happening with Superfast availability, and how to get the best deals and real benefits.

David also sought the support from the Parish Council as he is planning a Trail race on 22 April 2017 from about 10.00 until 2ish. He would like to use Wilson Park as a start and finish point.

07/17 Traffic Calming Meeting with Cumbria County Council

08/17 Phone Box Closures

Resolved that the Parish Council fully support the response from SLDC (against the closures) regarding the proposed closure of telephone boxes including 3 in our parish.

09/17 Digital Inclusion Event (Superfast Broadband)

Resolved to support the event (as detailed in public participation). Several Cllrs offered to deliver postcards and posters will be put up to advertise.

10/17 Potential Trail Race in Broughton

Resolved that Wilson Park can be used as a start and finish point for the Trail Race.

11/17 Community Led Plan

It was hoped that a meeting could be set up between the Community Led Plan Steering Group and the Parish Council. However as two of the parish councillors who are on the Community Led Plan working group are not available it was **Resolved** that Annette will send an update to the clerk monthly.

12/17 Sale of Allotment Field at Foxfield

Consideration was given to selling a field at Foxfield which is used as an allotment garden and valued at £7,500. **Resolved** to sell the field and to have a restriction in the conveyance to prevent any development on the field.

13/17 Public Toilets

- a) The clerk had not found any suitable boxes, it was therefore agreed that Cllr Edmondson will contact M Knowles to find out how much it will cost to have some honesty boxes made and installed.
- b) The clerk had a quotation on how much it will cost to smarten up the toilets totaling £7600 for the ladies and the gents. The disabled had not yet been quoted for.

14/17 Street Lighting

Thomas Butler & Son have sent a letter to the Council advising that they thought it unnecessary to repair the street light as there is another light on the other side of the road almost opposite the light on Syke House. The Parish Council agree with the contents of the letter and it was **Resolved** not to get the light repaired.

a) Consideration was given to the training programme provided by Calc. Resolved that the clerk will organise training in the Victory Hall. **Resolved** that the clerk can complete the CILCA course and the Parish Council will fund it.
